

## Title of the extended abstract

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- 1 Paper size is A4 with text width and height of 130 and 200 mm, respectively.
- 2 Font to be used is 'Times' (default) with justified side alignments and the font sizes are: Title 18pt., Author list and affiliations 14pt., E-mail address and keywords 11pt., Section titles 16pt., Text, figure captions and bibliography 10pt., Footnotes if any 8pt.
- 3 The abstract title and authors should be in bold and the presenting author should be underlined.
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- 5 Section titles (and subtitles) should be numbered 1. 2. ... (and 1.1 1.2 ...). They should be in bold.
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Make sure that the labels and all other text in the figure/figures have readable and comfortable font size, i.e. not smaller then 10pt. Use a suitable format of the figure file.




Figure 1: (a) Velocity distribution in time. (b) Velocity distribution in the downstream direction.



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- In general: be precise.
- No need to explain basic concepts.
- Structure your work clearly into sections
- Formulate a clear research question/multiple research questions.
- Formulate your (planned) research methods and why you are applying them.
- Formulate the context (be concise).
- Formulate expected outcomes.
- Language: English (be consistent if you choose for either US English or UK English).
- Cite the sources in a consistent way.
